Felicia Hermle will be our May General

Meeting speaker. Ms. Hermle has worked in the field since 2012, starting out as a Substance Use Disorder Counselor Intern at New Life Community Services in Santa Cruz while at the same

time managing a sober living home. Currently, she is working at Family & Children Services of

Silicon Valley as a Substance Use Disorder Counselor. This past fall, as a Master level stu-

dent in Social Work, she started her first MSW internship in the Mental Health Department and

is part of a pilot program called Integrated Behavioral Health Services.

The topic she will be presenting is dual diagnosis and why integrated treatment is not only

important but necessary. Currently Felicia is the only Integrated Clinician at FCS. Felicia believes that this is a very exciting time to be in this field because we are slowly but surely making headway with the idea of integrated treatment, hopefully blooming into the norm for treating dual-diagnosed clients.

# Rona Hu, M.D., Schizophrenia, Bipolar Disorder and Specific Questions March 8, 2016 General Meeting Write-Up By Cole Buxbaum

**Dr. Rona Hu** has been affiliated with Stanford Hospital since 1990 and sees patients in the clinic, both in open and locked units; she specializes in schizophrenia, bipolar disorder and depression. She is very passionate about her work, having suffered with a close friend who took her life by suicide. She feels that NAMI has helped to demystify and destigmatize mental illness. If a person is able to manage the illness with proper support, their life will be much better in general.

Dr. Hu talked about a major challenge today: the relationship between substance abuse & schizophrenia. Studies done in New Zealand are showing a relationship between a type of gene and patient response to dopamine (a neurotransmitter in the brain). Some patients have a much greater susceptibility to marijuana and display a higher risk in using the substance if they have schizophrenia. This is true for cocaine as well. If marijuana becomes available with no restrictions, a larger population, including those with schizophrenia, will suffer.

The question was raised relating to the accuracy of genetic testing and specific drug use. Dr. Hu explained this, but added that she would not do testing for all patients.

The question was raised regarding the relative benefit in treating negative and positive symptoms (negative symptoms relate to emotional flatness or lack of expressiveness, while positive symptoms are evident in patients who have lost touch with reality). Negative symptoms tend to be harder to treat but are not as disabling. In all cases, it is important to get the right dose.

Regarding obtaining information from a patient's doctor, it may be useful to fax or call the doctor requesting it. The physician can listen to questions and give general responses.
